The centerpiece of this course is a 5,000 word research paper on a topic of your choice. This research paper must meet the following criteria:

- It must be printed out on white 8.5" x 11" paper
- It must be double spaced
- It must contain at least 5,000 words
- It must have 1" margins on all four sides
- It must use Georgia, Garamond, or Times New Roman font
- It must use 12pt. font
- It must contain page numbers in the top right corner of each page
- It must have a properly formatted first page containing the author's name, the instructor's name, the name of the class, and the date of printing
- It must properly use in-line citations
- It must fully cite all sources used
- It must contain no spelling, punctuation, or grammatical errors
- It must include at least 3 non-wikipedia internet sources
- It must include at least 2 book sources
- It must include at least one printed periodical source
- It must include at least one source from an interview conducted by the author (that's you)
- It must include at least one visual source (photograph, painting, graph, etc.)

The class also requires a full reading of our book and careful consideration of its content in classroom discussion.

Note: The 25/50 rule is in effect. If you are absent¹ for more than 25% of classes you will receive a grade of fail which can be appealed to the administrative group in writing by your parents. If you are absent or tardy² from a sum total of half the classes you will receive a grade of fail.

¹ Absence is defined as being more than ten minutes late to any class.

² Tardy is defined as being less than ten minutes to any class.
